We restarted Bingo last night, with over 100 players and a solid crew working. Brenda Ravenscraft is now in charge of the kitchen. We stayed with the same prices in the kitchen, since this was our first night open, but because of how much food costs have increased, there may be some changes in October. With the help of the five additional games that were sold on the floor, we were able to provide the regular levels of prize money and still break even. The kitchen deposited \$440.

Our speaker this morning was Tracy Titmus, executive director of the Mid Missouri Art Alliance here in town. Tracy talked about the fact that they have been in their space for six years, represent about twenty-five local artists of different art formats, and have five studio spaces that are full, plus always have a waiting list. They are currently open Thursday and Friday 10-6, and Saturday 10-2. They are open for Drop-in Drawing on Tuesday from 1-3 and a Community Art Night on Wednesdays from 6:30-9 where people can come in and work on art projects or just visit.

Mid Missouri Art Alliance is currently preparing for their biggest fundraiser, the Boone Plein Art competition. They will have artists from across the state, as well as from other states, come on Oct. 14th, with the actual outdoor paintings starting Oct. 15 at Elderblossom View Orchard & Winery, as well as a special session at 4:30 on Saturday at Eagle Knoll Golf Course. On Sunday, Oct. 16, the day will start with a sunrise painting opportunity at Carl & Sandy Freiling's property. All painting will be turned in at 3:30, followed by the Wet Paint Reception at the Elderblossom View Orchard & Winerv at 5:30. All artwork created over the weekend will be for sale and refreshments will be available for purchase during the reception.

Tracy also talked about the classes they are currently providing for students on Wed. after early release from classes and their children's and adult classes. If you are interested in classes or membership, their website is www.midmissouriartalliance.com. Business owners might be interested in their Art Bank program, which provides new artwork for your business space every three months.
