The 2nd Quarter Conference of the Optimist Eastern Missouri District will be held virtually on Feb. 23-24. As a service project in conjunction with this conference, clubs will hold food drives with a goal of at least 100 items during the month of January (but please not cans of corn or green beans). The food we collect will go to Helping Hands and possibly our local Buddy Pack program.

This morning, we enjoyed a breakfast provided by Bernie Bartel and Donna Wobbe. Thank you ladies for the delicious food!

Our speaker this morning was Sherry Eisenhart. She has lived in Missouri for many years, but moved to Ashland in 2007 while they built the house they currently live in, just south in Hartsburg. When she retired in June of this year, she made the decision to find a project to take on and chose walking the Camino de Santiago. In English, this is the Way of St. James, the Greater, whose bones were discovered near Compostela. The route she took starts in France and finishes 488 miles later in northern Spain. Approximately 30,000 people walked this entire route last year. For Sherry, this took thirty-two days in August and September. The first twenty-one days, she stayed with the same group and walked thirteen miles a day. After she started walking on her own, she normally walked over eighteen miles a day. She utilized guidebooks and apps on her phone to plan each day's routes. There are numerous hostels along the way for pilgrims to stay in.

Sherry brought many of the pictures she had taken and talked about the hilliness and rockiness of the path. She said that she changed shoes everyday and, once she discovered the option, would forward her backpack to the next night's lodgings so that she didn't have to carry the weight.

Sherry claimed that the hardest part for her was to just rest at the end of the day instead of adventuring and that the best part was all the people from around the World that she met.

When Sherry was finished sharing her amazing adventures, she drew for the Attendance drawing and Jan Palmer was thrilled to say, "It pays to attend!" Barrett figured the poker pot, since it was the final meeting of the month. Even though Bryan Chapman and Bernie Bartel had pairs, they lost to Barrett's pair of Kings.
