Our speaker this morning was our own Rev. Elmer Schiefer talking about the history of the Christian church. Any errors in this bulletin are on me because I'm not as articulate as Elmer was. He started by saying that the church started in 33 AD, with the Apostles Creed as the original statement of faith around 150 AD. The church grew and, around 300 AD, some believers broke away and wrote the Nicene Creed, which states that Jesus was the begotten son of God. The church continued to grow until 1054 when the Pope of Rome and the Patriarch of Constantinople in Turkey disagreed about theological issues, which resulted in the Pope and Patriarch excommunicating each other. This led to the founding of the Catholic and Greek Orthodox churches.

Growth continued for another 500 years until Martin

Luther chose to be a priest and started reading the Bible, which was only available in Latin. Because all Bibles were hand-written, the only people who had access were clergy. The church in Rome had started selling indulgences, which promised remission of sins, to raise money to build St. Peter's Basilica. In his reading of the Bible, Martin discovered verses that spoke of forgiveness through faith alone. He posted ninety-five theses which challenged the Church's traditions regarding indulgences and the Pope's authority and stated that people should be able to make their own decisions about their faith. Because Gutenberg had recently figured out a way to use movable print, the theses and copies of the Bible became widely shared, which led to the Protestant Reformation.
